

Swiftwater Rescue Training

In preparation for conditions such as those our community encountered during Hurricane Matthew, Greenville Fire/Rescue Department will be performing a series of active swiftwater rescue training drills in Weldon, NC. Over the next several weeks, 15 members of the department will travel to the Roanoke River in Weldon, N.C. The river in this area provides a unique opportunity for our staff to train in flood like waters while in a realistic, semicontrolled environment. Swiftwater rescue is a subset of the department's technical rescue training program. This type of rescue involves the use of specially trained personnel, utilizing highly technical techniques coupled with the use of ropes and mechanical advantage systems to save people from life threating conditions. We recognize that swiftwater rescues are low frequency-high risk events. Therefore, the department's number one goal with training exercises of this type is the safety of our personnel and other members of the community.
