













Dickinson Avenue Elevation














Approximate Site - River Park North Camping Platform






Approximate Site - GUC Property Platform





Approximate Sites of Camping Platforms








Project Description

- •Green Inf. Loan

- •Nitrogen removal of 252 lb/yr

From a treatment perspective the results are equal to converting about 10% of Town Creek Watershed to Coastal Plain Forest



Timeline

- August 2013: Application for Green Inf. Loan submitted to DWI
- August 2014: ER/EID approved by DWI
- November 2014: Council resolution accepting loan offer of \$10M
- August 2015: Approval of ER/EID Amendment by DWI
- November 2015: Council approval of loan application amendment requesting \$13.34M

Current offer: \$13,340,571 at 0% interest Savings of: \$4,500,000




Background - Town Creek Culvert





Why replace Town Creek Culvert?

- •Existing flooding conditions (undersized)
- •Aging infrastructure (1930s constr)
- Added flow from NCDOT
 10th Street Connector





Survey & Inspection



- Longitudinal cracking in roof and floor
- Concrete spall with exposed reinforcment
- Tap in locations with no patching/sealing
- Utility conflicts





















Green Infrastructure

- Open channel between 3rd and 4th Streets





Regional RSC

Design Size: 250' Long X 40' Wide





Options

- Stabilize slope, keep road closed, and continue with planned project (const. start - Oct 2016)
- Stabilize slope, keep road closed, and separate 3rd St. improvements (const. start July 2016)
- Stabilize, Repair, Open road, and then replace with planned project
