School Justice Partnership Memorandum of Understanding

On Wednesday, November 13, 2019, multiple parties in Pitt County joined together to sign the School Justice Partnership Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Representatives from Pitt County Board of Commissioners, Pitt County Board of Education, Pitt County Superintendent, Pitt County Sheriff's Office, and Court officials joined with Police Chiefs from Pitt County municipalities to execute the MOU which outlines the roles and responsibilities of each entity in showing support for the safety and welfare of the Pitt County school community.

The shared goal expressed in the MOU is to reduce the number of out of school suspensions and referrals to the court system. The basic principles in the MOU outline the statutory framework for school discipline, which balances the duty of schools to maintain a safe environment while avoiding the negative effects of exclusion from school. While maintaining the integrity of each agencies respective roles to investigate student misconduct, criminal or delinquent acts, the MOU emphasizes the use of the least restrictive measures while maintaining accountability. A Progress Monitoring Team, made up of representatives from each listed entity, will oversee implementation of the MOU and coordinate training. The parties involved are committed to the fair and equitable treatment of all persons and in no way does this MOU prevent, limit, or inhibit law enforcement response to criminal or delinquent acts.

This MOU is in response to the Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Act which increases the age of juvenile court jurisdiction to include crimes and infractions committed by 16 and 17 year olds (excluding motor vehicle offenses); 16 and 17 year olds who commit Class A-G felonies will automatically be transferred to adult court. This "Raise the Age" act, as it has been commonly referred to, goes into effect December 1, 2019. GPD staff has been following this legislation and additional training is being conducted for all sworn personnel.
