Each year, the third week in May is recognized as National EMS Week. 2020 marks the 46<sup>th</sup> Annual EMS Week. Greenville Fire/Rescue typically celebrates with a number of events and outreach campaigns, but due to COVID-19, this year the department is taking a different approach. At the beginning of the week, the department will be taking to social media to launch their #FlatFreddie campaign. Flat Freddie, Flat Stanley's uncle, is an Emergency Medical Technician or EMT.
