<u>Title of Item:</u> Lincoln Park Neighborhood Revitalization

Explanation:

Abstract: Lincoln Park is a neighborhood within the West Greenville Redevelopment Area that has been a priority zone for community development. Staff is actively working to increase the number and type of activities occurring in this neighborhood to support neighborhood revitalization. New construction of four (4) single-family units for low- to moderate- income buyers will increase home ownership opportunities for current or existing residents of West Greenville.

Explanation: As the primary goal of the Housing Division, staff is working to create and preserve affordable housing within West Greenville with new construction, owner-occupied rehabilitation, down payment assistance, and housing provider non-profit funding. This is a concentrated effort to maximize resources in a centralized location. Aligned with the 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan, staff is working to procure and recruit private and non-profit contractors to aid in the construction of new units along Fleming Street. The four (4) new units will be available to households at or below 80% of area median income with down payment assistance available up to 20% of the purchase price to qualifying buyers.

Other investment in the neighborhood includes substantial rehabilitation of owneroccupied units, lead hazard control and healthy home repairs to owner and renteroccupied units, and infrastructure improvements.

Fiscal Note: The estimated budget for the four new construction units is \$498,624.
