Greenville Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission Mission:

The Greenville Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission is hereby created for the primary purpose of advancing Greenville as a bicycle and pedestrian friendly community and for encouraging bicycling and walking among its citizens and visitors. The Commission will also provide advice and recommendations to the Greenville City Council on questions related to bicycle and pedestrian issues.

Greenville Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission Purpose:

- To study and promote the integration of bicycling and walking in City policies and practices;
- To study proposed changes in laws, regulations, and codes concerning bicycle riders, pedestrians, users of personal mobility devices, and related stakeholders and to advise the City Council;
- To educate and inform the public and local officials on bicycle and pedestrian issues;
- To facilitate citizen participation in matters involving bicycle and pedestrian questions;
- To serve as an advisory and discussion board for new bicycle lanes, sidewalks, trails, and routes proposed by City staff and other groups.

DRAFT OF MINUTES PROPOSED FOR ADOPTION BY THE GREENVILLE BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN COMMISSION February 5, 2020

CALL TO ORDER

Members of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Commission met on the above date at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. Chad Carwein, Chairperson, called the meeting to order and welcomed all those present. The following attended the meeting:

3. ADDITIONS/DELETIONS/APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mr. Kohler made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hemme and passed unanimously.

4. APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER 6, 2019 MINUTES

Mr. Raynor noted Item 4 (Approval of Minutes) should reflect October 2, 2019. Mr. Hemme made a motion to approve the minutes as requested. The motion was seconded by Mr. Smith and passed unanimously.

5. MEMBER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Sloan announced the Geri Smith, owner of Bicycle Post passed away Friday. Mr. Kohler asked about his term. Mr. Carwein has spoken to the City Clerk's office to validate terms for all members.

6. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Mr. Hardy-Braz announced the Ride for Silence is scheduled for May 20, 2020 at 6pm. A citizen addressed the flashing lights at the 10th Street connector and expressed her concerns in the lack of awareness of drivers to stop at the flashing lights for pedestrians.

7. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

A. Recreation and Parks

Mr. Minner stated there were no new projects with the Recreation and Parks Department.

B. Engineering

Mr. Raynor stated the 2019 Street Resurfacing Project is in progress. MPO Staff has applied for funding for a Comprehensive ADA review within the city limits of Greenville. Notification should be given in April or May 2020. Mr. Raynor also introduced Eliud De Jesus as MPO Coordinator

with the City of Greenville.

C. Traffic Safety Action Committee Update

Ms. Evans stated no meetings have been scheduled to date for 2020.

Kip Sloan announced he would be stepping down from the board.
