# **Code Enforcement Update: A J Basile and Larry Hopkins**

Mr. Jones: This will be a question and answer session.

Mr. Jensen: The Commission had asked that statistics from Code Enforcement be presented at tonight's meeting.

Mr. Jones: In June, I will have the Code Enforcement Division bring the total breakdown for Commission members.

Ms. Diggs: How many Code Enforcement officers are there?

Mr. Basile: Presently, there are six officers with a seventh officer being hired with the new budget. Each officer is assigned a specific area of the City.

Ms. Diggs: Do citizens call the officer assigned to the specific area?

Mr. Basile: No just call 329-4110. Code Enforcement's map almost matches police map, so we can work with police patrols.

Mr. Abboud praised Mr. Basile for his work.

Mr. Basile: Each area has its own sets of problems. There are more minimum housing cases with tenants and landlords in heavily rundown areas and these areas are extremely understaffed.

Ms. Diggs: What area does Mr. Hopkins have?

Mr. Hopkins: I have Evans Street up to the Tar River Neighborhood Association.

Ms. Diggs: Who has the Firetower Road area?

Mr. Hopkins: I am one of the officers working in that area.

Mr. Abboud: Who is responsible for trash in the right-of-way?

Mr. Jones: Public Works is responsible. They are responsible for mowing, so the trash should be picked up. Firetower is a state maintained road.

Mr. Caspar: Do you know how the bar area gets cleaned up?

Mr. Jones: Public Works does it.

Mr. Caspar: Public Works does not clean up the area where the kids walk and drop trash on their way home.

Mr. Basile: If I see the trash is in the right-of-way, I call Public Works to come and clean up.

Mr. Caspar: The area looks better.

Mr. Abboud: Try to address issues within neighborhood and then go to Code Enforcement.

Mr. Kachroo: Increasing awareness in the diplomatic way.

Ms. Diggs: Public Service Announcements (PSAs) should be done to educate citizens. Positive PSAs could be done for litter.

Mr. Jones: I will ask Code Enforcement to bring back before the Commission maps of officers' areas and statistical reports.

### Neighborhood Improvement Grant (NIG) Discussion

Mr. Jones: Neighborhood Improvement Grants will be brought before the Commission in June. May 18<sup>th</sup> is the deadline for grants. I am writing up the guidelines for the grant money. The subcommittee of the NIG will work guidelines out. I have two applications, and I think there will be two more.

Ms. Diggs: I am trying to find out if I can apply for second grant.

Mr. Caspar suggested that the guidelines for the grant be rushed.

Mr. Johnson: Money needs to be spent prior to more be awarded.

Mr. Abboud: The Commission needs a list of grants as to whether work has been done.

Mr. Jensen: Consecutive awards can be given but money must be spent.

Ms. Robertson: Can City Attorney help with the guidelines?

Mr. Jones: I have written guidelines for similar grants.

Mr. Kachroo: Ms. Diggs grant was in the past. How much time has to pass before money spent?

Mr. Johnson: The timeframe should be six months.

Mr. Jones: I will have guidelines ready before the June Commission meeting.
