I. AGENDA:

Mayor Tripp made a motion and Mayor Jackson seconded to approve the agenda as distributed and the motion passed unanimously.

II. MINUTES:

Mayor Tripp made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 17, 2009 meeting as presented. Mayor Boyd seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

There was no public comment.

IV. NEW BUSINESS:

A. PRIORITIZATION OF "SHOVEL-READY" PROJECTS TO BE SUBMITTED TO NCDOT FOR CONSIDERATION FOR STIMULUS FUNDING

Mayor Dunn turned the meeting over to Mr. David Brown. A conference call was in place with NCDOT representatives Calvin Leggett and Ray McIntyre. The purpose of this conference call was to define terms and conditions associated with Stimulus funds. Upon further discussion, the determinations were made as follows:

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Stimulus funds for Division 2 were allocated at 6.87% or \$50.5 Million.

"Shovel-Ready" projects were defined as those whose project plans and specifications are 98% to 100% complete, generally requiring no right-of-way acquisition, do not have any utility conflicts, and will comply with all federal contracting requirements.

The funds were being distributed in a wave of 120 days and one-year time frame with 50% of funds being apportioned to each time frame. It is anticipated funds not allocated by other divisions would be redistributed at the federal level. North Carolina plans to allocate 100% of its funds and be in a position to be eligible for redistributed funds.

Upon completion of the conference call, the group began the process of prioritizing lists for potential Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects and Potential Highway Projects. The lists are as follows:



SUBJECT: Amendment to 2009-2015 Metropolitan Transportation

Improvement Program (MTIP) for Transit Projects



Each year, the City of Greenville submits an application for operating/planning and capital funds to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to assist with the operation of the Greenville Area Transit System (GREAT) for the next fiscal year. In order for the application to be approved by FTA, it must reflect the approved MTIP and State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).

Greenville is applying for a Section 5307 grant for an amount greater than originally indicated in the MTIP adopted on August 12, 2008. The projects affected are:

- Preventative maintenance and misc. capital items (ID No. TG-4767)
- Expansion Busses (ID No. TA-4773)

These projects will assist the City of Greenville with additional bus purchases and small capital and operating expenses associated with operating a bus system. The grant funds are used to reimburse the City for one hundred percent of bus purchases and one-half the operating deficit and eighty percent of capital expenditures. Furthermore, the proposed amendment indicates a redesignation of the funding sources for the amended projects to reflect their status as funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

To ensure the FTA will approve the City's grant application, the amount requested must correspond to those presented in the 2009-2015 MTIP and STIP. Therefore, the 2009-2015 MTIP must be amended. The North Carolina Board of Transportation is anticipated to consider amending the 2009-2015 STIP for item TG-4767 on May 5, 2009 and for item TA-4773 during their June, 2009 meeting.

Attached for TAC's consideration is *Resolution 2009-08-GUAMPO*, which details the changes. Also, attached is a copy of page 6 of 7 of the current 2009-2015 MTIP identifying the existing status of the aforementioned projects. Project TG-4767 was previously amended on December 2, 2008 for the purpose of changing the funding amounts and Resolution No. 2008-07 GUAMPO is attached.

For the upcoming TAC meeting, it is requested that the committee adopt the amendment to the 2009-2015 MTIP as recommended by the TCC during their May 12, 2009 meeting.

Due to the receipt of stimulus funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the North Carolina Board of Transportation has amended the 2009-2015 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) on March 5, 2009 for the inclusion of project ER-5100, Statewide Roadside Environmental Projects and Tree Plantings. As the name of the project implies, these funds would provide for roadside environmental projects and tree plantings.

To follow the proper protocol for the expenditure of Federal funds, the 2009-2015 MTIP must be amended to correspond with projects in the STIP. The North Carolina Board of Transportation amended the 2009-2015 STIP regarding this matter on March 5, 2009.

The attached amendment will provide the necessary changes to the 2009-2015 MTIP to allow any expenditure of these funds within the urbanized area. This amendment would place project ER-5100 in the *Enhancement Projects (Roadside)* section of the MTIP (pages S-10 and S-11), in the statewide portion of the MTIP.

NCDOT's Transportation Mobility and Safety Division (formerly the Traffic Engineering Branch) is requesting a resolution of support and concurrence for the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of NC 903 and Reedy Branch Road. NCDOT requires a resolution of support and concurrence for any State-funded Spot Safety project exceeding \$150,000 within an Urbanized Area. The estimated construction cost for this project is \$250,000. The intersection of NC 903 and Reedy Branch Road is routinely identified in NCDOT's bi-annual Highway Safety Improvement Program. Numerous angle and frontal impact accidents have occurred at this intersection.

The project was initiated in 2004 as a state-funded Spot Safety project after being identified in the Highway Safety Improvement Program as a potentially hazardous location. The original project involved relocating the roadside drainage ditch back to the R/W line along the south side of NC 903 from a point 1800 feet west of Reedy Branch Road to Reedy Branch Road and to provide 2-foot paved shoulders at a cost of \$15,000. (There is \$35,000 currently allocated for this work due to a cost estimate revision a few years ago.) Due to continuing questions concerning the project and continuing crashes, NCDOT's local Division office was led to review the site to determine additional reasonable countermeasures to reduce crashes. In addition to this there was also a telephone inquiry from the County Commissioner Jimmy Garris on November 14, 2008 requesting NCDOT review the location. Winterville Mayor Doug Jackson had inquired in the past about putting four way stop signs or other crash mitigating measures at this intersection. As NCDOT investigated the issues, they decided the best course of action would be to build a roundabout at a cost of \$250,000 with a Benefit-to-Cost ratio of 27.45.

Per the most recent traffic volume count of January, 2009, the traffic volumes are below the threshold required for signalization as detailed in the *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices*.

Attached is *Resolution No. 2009-10-GUAMPO*, supporting construction of a roundabout at the intersection of NC 903 and Reedy Branch Road.

It is requested that the TAC adopt the resolution supporting the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of NC 903 and Reedy Branch Road as recommended by the TCC during their May 12, 2009 meeting.

Map



In 2001, revisions were made to North Carolina General Statute 136-66.2 that was intended to expand current transportation planning in North Carolina to include consideration of non-roadway alternatives. The statute now calls for the development of a Coordinated Transportation Plan (CTP). The CTP is a long-term "wish-list" of recommended transportation improvements intended for an entire MPO planning area. It doesn't have a specific timeline, cost, or funding source. The plan is expected to be a living document that provides for inter-jurisdictional cooperation and planning to replace the previously used thoroughfare plans. The CTP shall be based on information such as population growth, economic conditions and prospects, and patterns of land development in and around municipalities. In the development of the CTP, consideration shall be given to all transportation modes including: street systems; transit alternatives; and bicycle, pedestrian, and operating strategies. The MPO may include projects in its CTP that are not included in a financially constrained plan (Long-Range Transportation Plan or LRTP) or are anticipated to be needed beyond the horizon year of a LRTP. The CTP includes projects within the LRTP planning horizon and beyond. For this reason, it is desirable that the roadway portion of the CTP, at a minimum, should be completed before an update to the LRTP is completed.

The process for updating the "Draft" CTP Highway Map is as follows:

- The TCC will review and discuss the MPO's attached "Draft" CTP Highway Map. (completed)
- The TAC will consider presenting the "Draft" CTP Highway Map to the public. (completed)
- The Lead Planning Agency (LPA) and NCDOT will revise the "Draft" CTP Highway Map as necessary and make it available for public review and comment. (completed)
- After a public comment period and public hearings are held in each jurisdiction (**completed**), the "Draft" CTP Highway Map along with public comments will be presented to the TCC for further review and discussion to be recommended to the TAC for consideration and adoption.
- After TAC adoption, NCDOT's Board of Transportation shall consider the CTP Highway Map for adoption.



<u>Greenville Urban Area "Draft" Comprehensive Transportation Plan Highway Map Public Hearing</u>

Mayor Boyd introduced Mr. Vreeland. Mr. Vreeland stated he has come tonight to present to you a draft Comprehensive Transportation Plan Highway Map. In basic summary this map is an update to the existing thoroughfare plan. He brought the thoroughfare plan map with him and showed the changes on the map. Mr. Vreeland stated I come before you as a representative of the Metropolitan Planning Organization. MPO is compiled of the City of Greenville and Pitt County, representing unincorporated sections of the MPO, Town of Winterville, Town of Ayden and Village of Simpson and DOT and FHWA. The CTP Highway Map updates the Thoroughfare Plan. The purpose of the highway map is the update plan which is used by Local Regional, State and Federal decision makers. A Plan provides for land preservation for future transportation corridors and helps guide decisions on setbacks and transportation improvements as development occurs today and into the future. The purpose of the plan is that it is a long range multi mogul Transportation Plan. In the future there will be other elements of the Plan. This does not promise to build roads, but this is like a wish list of roads we would like to have. There is not necessarily money to allocate for all these projects.

Mr. Vreeland stated that before you the Draft Map. In short comparison between the Thoroughfare Plan and Draft Map is there are now we have freeways, expressways, boulevards, major thoroughfares and minor thoroughfares with five classifications. In the Thoroughfare Plan there are only three classifications. Changes to the existing Thoroughfare Plan are at cityofgreenvillenc.gov web site online, under departments and then public works.

Tonight we are asking for a public hearing to receive public comment on any mode of transportation. Comments for projects to be included the CTP and will be considered for the next long range plan.

Mayor Boyd stated that the public hearing is open for comments and questions. Mr. Eugene Williamson asked if waterways were in the plan and Mr. Vreeland stated that boats were not in the plan. Mr. Williamson also asked about ramps to the river and Port Terminal is with in the City of Greenville. 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if it would help to get it here. Mayor Boyd stated he would have to talk to the City of Greenville about the Great Bus, but there was comment from the City of Greenville that there would be cost to Simpson with insurance and other cost. They were not sure if it would justify getting the Great Bus. Mayor Boyd does see a need for public transportation in Simpson. Attorney Keen Lassiter asked the question about the main road through Simpson if that was a resurfacing. Mr. Vreeland stated that it is a road widening and not resurfacing. Mayor Boyd stated that we have been allocated the money for the road widening project, but there is one property owner that has given us problems to start the project and now the Governor has put a hold on the highway project money. Mr. Vreeland stated that the project is on the map to be widened to Avon Road. There were no other comments or questions,

Greenville Urban Area "Draft" Comprehensive Transportation Plan Highway Map - James Rhodes

Information Provided with the Agenda

In 2001, revisions were made to North Carolina General Statute 136-66.2 to expand current transportation planning in North Carolina to include consideration of non-roadway alternatives. The statute now calls for the development of a Coordinated Transportation Plan (CTP). The CTP is a long-term "wish-list" of recommended transportation improvements intended for an entire Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) planning area. It does not identify specific timelines, costs, or funding sources for identified projects. The plan is expected to be a living document that provides for inter-jurisdictional cooperation and planning to replace previously used thoroughfare plans.

The purpose of a Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) is to update the official Greenville Urban Area Thoroughfare Plan that is used by local, regional, state and federal decision-makers. It is developed jointly by local government representatives to Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) and the North Carolina Department of Transportation. In the development of the CTP, consideration shall be given to all transportation modes including: street systems; transit alternatives; and bicycle, rail, pedestrian, and operating strategies.

The plan provides for land reservation of future transportation corridors and helps to guide decisions on setbacks and transportation improvements as development occurs today and into the future.

The CTP can be used to help develop the Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), which is a fiscally-constrained 20-year plan, and will assist with the development of short range plans, such as the State's Transportation Improvement Plan.

The Greenville Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (GUAMPO) is seeking public comment and input on the "Draft" CTP Highway Map. GUAMPO is also accepting comment on other modes of transportation to aid in the future development of the other (non-automobile) CTP maps (bicycle, pedestrian, and rail & public transportation), as well as for projects the public would like to see included in the Long Range Transportation Plan update.

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Staff Recommendation

Hold a public hearing to receive public input and endorse the "Draft" CTP Highway Map and the Long-Range Transportation Plan update.

Manager Comments

Concur with recommendation to 1)hold public hearing and receive public input and 2) endorse the "draft" CTP Highway Map and the Long-Range Transportation Plan update.

GREENVILLE URBAN AREA DRAFT COMPREHENSIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN HIGHWAY MAP – APPROVED

Mr. Daryl Vreeland, Transportation Planner, explained that the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Highway Map updates the Thoroughfare Plan. The purpose of the Comprehensive Transportation Plan's Highway Map is to update the official Thoroughfare Plan that is used by local, regional, state and federal decision-makers. The Plan provides for land reservation for future transportation corridors and helps guide decisions on setbacks and transportation improvements as development occurs today and into the future. Per State Statute, each MPO, with the cooperation of the Department of Transportation, shall develop a CTP that will serve present and anticipated travel demands. A CTP is a long-range multi-modal transportation plan developed cooperatively between the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the Metropolitan Planning Organization. It emphasizes the incorporation of local land use plans and community and statewide goals (such as State Strategic Highway Corridors). Recommendations are conceptual projects. A CTP does not determine a pinpoint location of new roads, make a promise to buil roads, and is not fiscally constrained. A Long Range Transportation Plan is a minimum 20-year plan, and a Comprehensive Transportation Plan shows needs for 30 or more years. A comparison between the Thoroughfare Plan and CTP was given:

Mr. Vreeland reviewed the existing and potential sidewalk locations and the future proposed bicycle routes. He stated that the benefits of a CTP are:

- Common long-range vision for multi-modal facilities between NCDOT, MPOs, RFOs and local governments
- Better project information for programming and project development
- Better integration of transportation planning with land use planning
- Reduced project costs by identifying the need for protection of future right-of-way corridors
- Stronger ties to local priorities

Mr. Vreeland stated that a draft CTP Highway Map has been presented to the Technical Coordinating Committee and Transportation Advisory Committee, and a public information workshop has been held. The draft is currently being submitted to local agencies for public comment. The public comments and the draft map will then be presented to the Transportation Coordinating Committee and the Transportation Advisory Committee for adoptions. Comments are being solicited for projects to be includ4ed in the CTP, which will also be considered in the development of the next Long Range Transportation Plan. The draft CTP, maps and a copy of the presentation are available on the MPO's webpage.

Upon being asked about the funding for projects that have already been approved, Mr. Vreeland replied that the Tenth street Connector has funding associated with it. More information will be available in the next month or so on what happens after the stimulus package is distributed for shovel-ready projects. City Manager Bowers stated that most of the major projects do involve federal funding. That will be a difficult process because of decrease in gasoline tax.

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Upon being asked if there is money for the rail project, City Manager Bowers stated that funding has been committed by the State, and they are waiting for federal funding. An update will be provided on that later.

Upon being asked what input the City has on this, the City Manager stated that the MPO is staffed by the Public Works and Community Development Departments. The governing body of the MPO is elected officials. Mayor Dunn represents the City on that.

Mayor Dunn declared the public hearing open and solicited comments from the audience. There being none, the public hearing was closed.

Motion was made by Council Member Joyner and seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Council to approve the Greenville Urban Area Draft Comprehensive Transportation Plan Highway Map. Motion carried unanimously. (Document No. 09-4)

SUBJECT: 2009-2035 Long Range Transportation Plan Update



Every five years, Metropolitan Planning Organizations are required by federal law to update their long-range transportation plans (LRTP). The Greenville Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization last adopted its LRTP in August, 2004. The 2009-2035 Long-Range Transportation Plan updates the 2004-2030 LRTP to a Year 2035 planning horizon; summarizes the transportation-related plans, statistics, activities, and programs of the Greenville Urban Area MPO and its member agencies; and includes a financial plan.

The major changes presented in the 2009-2035 LRTP Update are the new sections added (as required by Federal Regulations), which include discussion of environmental justice and other environmental concerns and potential mitigation efforts on a regional basis for the urbanized area.

The process for updating the 2009-2035 LRTP is as follows:

- The TCC will review and discuss the MPO's attached "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP. (completed)
- The TAC will consider presenting the "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP to the public.
- The Lead Planning Agency (LPA) and NCDOT will revise the "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP as necessary and make it available for public review and comment.
- After a 30-day public comment period the "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP along with public comments will be presented to the TCC for further review and discussion to be recommended to the TAC for consideration and adoption.
- After TAC adoption, the 2009-2035 LRTP will be transmitted to NCDOT.

Development of the "draft" document was coordinated with NCDOT-Transportation Planning staff. The "draft" document was presented to Federal Highway Administration for initial input. Their edits and comments have been incorporated within the attached "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP.

In preparation for the upcoming TAC meeting, it is recommended that committee members review the attached and be prepared to discuss and provide comment on the "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP.

It is requested that the TAC consider presenting the "Draft" 2009-2035 LRTP to the public as recommended by the TCC during their May 12, 2009 meeting.


