#### GREENVILLE URBAN AREA MPO'S TITLE VI NOTICE TO PUBLIC

U.S. Department of Justice regulations, 28 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 42.405, Public Dissemination of Title VI Information, require recipients of Federal financial assistance to publish or broadcast program information in the news media. Advertisements must state that the program is an equal opportunity program and/or indicate that Federal law prohibits discrimination. Additionally, reasonable steps shall be taken to publish information in languages understood by the population eligible to be served or likely to be directly affected by transportation projects.

The Greenville Urban Area MPO hereby gives public notice that it's the policy of the MPO to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, Executive Order 12898 Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations, Executive Order 13166 Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency, and related nondiscrimination statutes and regulations in all programs and services. It is the MPO's policy that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, age, income status, national origin, or disabilities be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program, activities, or services for which the MPO receives Federal financial assistance.

Any person who believes they have been mistreated by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with the Greenville Urban Area MPO. Any such complaint must be in writing or in person to the City of Greenville, Public Works-- Engineering, MPO Title VI Coordinator, 1500 Beatty St, Greenville, NC 27834, within one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discrimination occurrence. #### I. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A motion was made by Commissioner Garris to approve the agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Mayor Jackson and passed unanimously.

#### II. MINUTES

A motion was made by Mayor Jackson to approve the minutes of the November 4, 2014 and as presented. Mayor Boyd seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

#### III. ELECTION OF CHAIRPERSON AND VICE-CHAIRPERSON

Commissioner Garris made a motion to elect Mayor Allen Thomas as Chairperson and Mayor Steve Tripp as Vice-Chairperson. The motion was seconded by Mayor Jackson. The motion passed unanimously.

#### IV. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

There were no public comments.

#### V. NEW BUSINESS / ACTION ITEMS

#### A. Draft 2016-202 STIP

Mr. Vreeland announced the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) had distributed the draft 2016-2025 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to all Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) asking for input. Mr. Vreeland explained all projects must be included in the MPO's long-range plan to be considered for funding by NCDOT. If a project has not been previously submitted, the list must be amended to include the project. Mr. Vreeland directed attention to the bubble chart on page 10 of the agenda package to define the planning process of the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP).

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# B. Potential new projects and modification to existing projects seeking Federal funding; Timeline for NCDOT's next cycle of project prioritization

Mr. Vreeland explained NCDOT has prepared a draft timeline for the next 2-year project prioritization cycle. They refer to this as "prioritization 4.0" ("p4.0" for short), representing the 4th cycle that the State has implemented their transparent prioritization process, relying heavily on quantitative data. In August/September of 2015, MPO's will be required to provide modifications of existing projects and submit new candidate projects from the MPO's adopted long range plan (MTP).

Mayor Thomas questioned the Greenville Boulevard project. Mr. Vreeland noted the project is currently identified in the proposed modifications as project 5 and the project is proposed to be modified from a widening to modernization/improvement project. A design review meeting regarding the Greenville Boulevard feasibility study is estimated to occur March 17, 2015.

Mrs. Lipscomb asked if Dickinson Avenue improvements should be included in this process. Mr. Cabaniss noted the portion of Dickinson Avenue in question was not City maintained. Mr. Vreeland stated North Carolina is in a bond process and Dickinson Avenue is a project that could be included in a possible statewide bond. Furthermore, the project is an eligible Division-level project that is proposed to be submitted to NCDOT as part of the upcoming prioritization process.

# C. Amendment to the 2012-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add the following projects: U-5730, U-5785, and U-5870

Mr. Vreeland presented the requested amendments to the 2012-2018 TIP to add the following projects:

- 1. U-5730 US13 (Memorial Drive), NC43 (5<sup>th</sup> Street) Upgrade Intersection
  - Programmed for planning and environmental study only to expedite delivery of new Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) project.
- 2. U-5785 SR1708 (Firetower Rd), NC 43 (Charles Boulevard) to SR 1704 (Fourteenth St) Widen to multi-lanes.
  - Programmed for planning and environmental study only to expedite delivery of new (STI) project.
- 3. U-870 SR1708 (Firetower Road), SR1704 (Fourteenth Street) to NC33 Widen to multi-lanes
  - Programmed for planning and environmental study only to expedite delivery of new (STI) project.

A motion was made by Commissioner Garris to amend the TIP as presented. The motion was seconded by Mayor Jackson and passed unanimously.

#### D. Draft Strategic Transportation Corridors Policy and Map Attachment

Mr. Vreeland stated NCDOT has developed a draft STC policy and map which identifies the network of transportation facilities deemed to be critical for achieving the State's economic development goals. The 2040 Plan recommended the Strategic Highway Corridors (SHC) network adopted in 2004 be updated to reflect multiple

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transportation mode and changes in North Carolina's transportation demands. The draft policy and map was scheduled for a briefing to NCDOT's Board of Transportation in February 2015 with adoption of the STC to be considered at their March 15, 2015 meeting.

Mr. Vreeland also noted he has submitted comments requesting the NC11 corridor to reflect the Southwest Bypass alignment. NCDOT replied that the STC reflects conditions as they currently exist and will be adjusted as the bypass is built.

#### **E.** Pitt County commuting patterns

Mr. Vreeland directed attention to the handout from Airsage in the agenda package. Mr. Vreeland stated Airsage is a for-profit collection company that recently released a free snapshot of nationwide travel data collected by anonymous cell phone data taken over the course of the month of April 2014. Mr. Vreeland further stated he had created a chart for the number of people commuting into Pitt County as well as a chart for the number of people living in Pitt County and commuting elsewhere. The report and charts are for informational purposes only; however, more studies could be developed by Airsage as requested by the MPO.

#### F. Presentation by Reza Jafari, PE, NCDOT

Mr. Reza Jafari, PE, NCDOT gave a presentation on Highway Safety Improvement Program. The presentation is available with the March 4, 2015 meeting minutes.

They refer to this as "prioritization 4.0" ("p4.0" for short), representing the 4th cycle that the State has implemented their transparent prioritization process, relying heavily on quantitative data.

In August/September of 2015, MPO's will be required to provide modifications of existing (previously submitted) projects and submit new candidate projects. New projects must be in the MPO's adopted long range plan (MTP).

The following is a slightly refined version of the list of changes/new projects initially provided to TCC/TAC at the Feb/March 2015 MPO meetings. They have been refined to incorporate any feedback staff has received.

The Regional list would have the following projects removed, since they are in the 5-year portion of the draft TIP, thereby being funded and not needing or subject to reprioritization:

- 1. NC11/NC43(5th St) intersection improvement (dual LT lanes EB to NB)
- 2. SW Bypass Section A
- 3. SW Bypass Section B
- 4. SW Bypass Section C

The Division list would have the following project removed. Note that Right-of-Way and Utilities were the only phases scheduled in the first 5 years of the draft TIP, with construction scheduled in year 7. According to NCDOT's guidance, projects with either construction or Right-of-Way scheduled within the first 5 years of the TIP are not subject to reprioritization. Thus it can be removed from the MPO's project list.

5. Firetower road widening, NC43 to 14th St

<u>Action Needed</u>: Discuss project modifications and proposed new projects. The Regional and Division project lists must be adopted at the next TAC meeting currently scheduled for August, 25 2015.

<u>Purpose:</u> Receive information regarding the Governor's proposed transportation bond.

#### Discussion:

#### \$1.4B Highway Bond

On April 17, 2015, Gov. Pat McCrory announced two \$1.4 billion bonds for both roads and infrastructure projects across the state.

The highway bond would distribute funding consistent with the Strategic Mobility Formula and would <u>fund 27 highway projects across North Carolina</u> - two of which are already scheduled in the later years of NCDOT's Draft 10-Year Plan.

- View a map of projects that would be funded under the bond
- See how the projects would fit in with a greater infrastructure improvement plan.

Bond funding for those projects – in Greensboro and Fayetteville – would allow them to be completed sooner and would make room for new projects in the Draft 10-Year Plan. These two projects are part of the proposed bond because they are ready for construction and meet budget constraints.

The other 25 projects were selected because they meet funding constraints of the bond, are ready for construction and were the next highest-scoring projects under the Strategic Mobility Formula that could not be funded in the Draft 10-Year Plan.

In addition to the highway projects, the bond would also pay for <u>176 unpaved secondary roads</u> across the state, totaling 113 miles. They are next in priority order that are eligible for paving.

Within the MPO boundary, there is only one project that is listed in the above-linked documentation:

U5606 - Dickinson Ave modernization.
