

The Greenville Police Department exists to enhance public safety and quality of life, in partnership with ALL people in OUR community, by preventing crime with honor and integrity.



Subject: Community Outreach Report – July 15, 2018 to July 31, 2018

We continue to further our strategic goals to build trust and legitimacy by interacting, collaborating and promoting good citizenship within our jurisdictions to improve community police relations and ultimately to reduce crime. Please find below a “Spotlight” feature and highlights of our community interactions.

Spotlight on Kindness and Professionalism: On July 22, 2018 Officer Chad Bowen responded to a call involving one of our citizens who thought that there were people trespassing in the backyard. Officer Bowen checked the yard but found no evidence of intruders. After talking with friends and neighbors it soon became apparent that the citizen was imagining the intrusions and was possibly suffering from Parkinson’s.



The neighbors on the scene described Officer Chad Bowen’s actions as he completed his assignment as:

“...warm, personable, friendly, caring, understanding, respectful and professional and extremely knowledgeable. He was just beyond impressive at how kindly he handled the situation... He was not rushed and was soft spoken the entire time. His demeanor was calming.”

This archival picture shows Officer Bowen doing what he loves to do - interacting with our citizens.

Highlights

- **Adopt-A-School Program** – Officer Felix Monterrosa who is assigned to The Oakwood School received “rave reviews” from Ms Kelly Robbins, Admissions Director for the relationships built with students and faculty. Officer Monterrosa provided input to the school’s crisis response plan and provided insights when concerns were raised about school shootings.
- **Lip Sync Battle** - Officers participated in the nationwide Law Enforcement Lip Sync Battle. The video, which was filmed and edited by City of Greenville videographer Kelvin Thomas, has been viewed more than 150,000 times online and has received a great response from the community. Check it out here: <https://vimeo.com/279869432> . Officer Nock has turned into quite the

celebrity since his appearance in our Lip Sync Battle video. A little girl recognized him from the video and it made her day when he took a photograph with her at the Umbrella Market.

- **Greenville Police Department (GPD) Promotions** - Four officers were promoted to sergeant and lieutenant positions. Congratulations to Sgt. Keith Garner, Sgt. Chris Burack, Sgt. Richie Williams and Lt. Scott Stanton. Sgt. Garner, Sgt. Burack and Lt. Stanton will be working in our patrol division, while Sgt. Williams will continue working in our community outreach division.
- **GPD's K9 for a Day Program** – The partnership with GPD and the Humane Society of Eastern Carolina, continues to be a success. All of the animals featured in ride-alongs to date have been adopted. Our latest K9 for a Day, Si, a 9-week old German Shepherd/Lab mix, was adopted by Sgt. Glen Webb. Si, now “Deacon,” is settling in nicely in his new home.
- **Neighborhood Officers** – Officers Paladino, Gillen, Blackmon and Greene stopped by the Dream Park to unwind with some awesome kids. See picture taken by City photographer Aaron Hines.
- **Lemonade Stand** - Danyetta Sneed “caught” Officer Carnevale and Officer Bowen in an act of kindness. The officers stopped by her daughter, Santana’s lemonade stand last week. Danyetta told us Santana was “stoked” to see them. Santana raised \$261 dollars for the Lupus Foundation of America, American Diabetes Association and the American Cancer Society.

Upcoming Events

- **August 4, 2018 – “West Greenville Community Unity Block Party”** from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. - We are partnering with the West Greenville Health Council which is a citizen led group with the mission to increase the quality of life in the West Greenville neighborhoods by addressing crime, health and police community relations.
- **August 7, 2018 – “National Night Out”** from 6:00 -8:00 p.m. in 5 locations as follows: Uptown: 5th Street Plaza; East Zone: Jaycee Park; South Zone: Boyd Lee Park; West Zone: Dream Park and in the North West: Barnes Ebron-Taft Building. Re: Town Common Development – Boat Dock and Parking Lot Design

As current construction projects near completion, Recreation and Parks continues to plan for future development at Town Common. Currently we are in the planning phase for a public/private development on a piece of property located on the Northeast end of the park. We are also in the planning stage for a boat dock and much needed parking improvements. As such, City staff met with The East Group in late June to discuss the project scope and request a proposal for on-call engineering services.

The East Group and the City have agreed upon the project scope and deliverables, and are currently in contract negotiations for 30% construction documents associated with writing a public/ private development RFP, and professional engineering services required for parking lot realignment, boat dock design, and no-rise certification.

The City anticipates having an executed contract in early August and issuing a notice to proceed. Please let me know if you have any questions.
