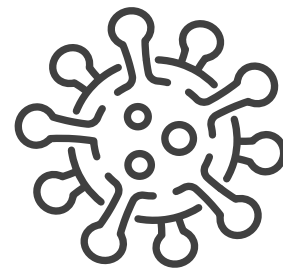


COVID-19 — MAY 2020

NORTH CAROLINA REOPENING PHASE 1



GOVERNOR ROY COOPER IS MOVING THE STATE TO PHASE 1 OF REOPENING ON MAY 8 AT 5:00 P.M. HERE IS WHAT IT MEANS FOR GREENVILLE:



Personal Care and Hygiene	
Wash hands often	Continue to wash hands in an effort to prevent the spread of germs.
Cover coughs	Continue to cover coughs in an effort to prevent the spread of germs.
Don't go out if ill	Continue to stay home if you are feeling sick or have a fever.
Face mask if out in public	The CDC recommends wearing masks when in public.
Surface and object cleaning	Continue to sanitize surfaces and objects regularly.
Physical distancing	Continue to stay 6 feet from others to prevent the spread of germs.
City of Greenville Facilities, Services, and Programs	
City business (payments, plans, permits, etc.)	Visit www.greenvillenc.gov , call (252) 329-2489, or download the City Compass mobile app
City indoor facilities	Remain closed to the public until further notice.
Recreation programs	All indoor and outdoor programming suspended through May 31.
Playgrounds, picnic shelters, public restrooms, Off-Leash Dog Area, Extreme Park	Closed until further notice.
Recreation Summer Day Camps	Postponed until July 6; Camps scheduled for June 8-July 3 are cancelled.
Transit service	Routes 1, 2, & 3 are suspended until further notice. Routes 4, 5, & 6 continue with the exception of Route 4 Saturday service. Buses are limited to no more than 19 passengers.
Restrictions Put in Place by North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper (Executive Order 138)	
Mass gatherings	Limit gatherings to 10 people or less or 50 or less for a funeral.
Bars and restaurants	Take-out or delivery service only.
Gyms, salons, theaters, massage, music venues, and bowling alleys	Closed until further notice.
Businesses that have not been explicitly required to be closed	Open as long as they are able to practice social distancing. Teleworking of employees is recommended.
Retail businesses	*Allowed to open at 50 percent capacity with frequent cleaning and while following social distancing guidelines.
Churches	Worship services of more than 10 outdoors are allowed with social distancing.
K-12 education	Schools are closed. Remote learning continues until May 22.
Child care centers	Open for working parents or those who are looking for work.
Visitation at long-term care centers	Not allowed at this time.

*Social distancing guidelines in Executive Order 138 that apply specifically to retail businesses include directing customers to stay at least 6 feet apart from one another and workers except at point of sale, marking 6 feet of spacing in lines at point of sale and other high-traffic areas, frequent cleaning and disinfection, providing hand sanitizer when available and soap and hand drying materials at sinks, daily symptom screening of workers, sending symptomatic workers home, having a plan for isolating workers if symptoms develop, and posting signage at main entrances to remind people of social distancing.

NOTE: It is the responsibility of the local law enforcement agencies to enforce the restrictions that are in place across the state. The City will do its best to enforce the Governor's requirements through education and voluntary compliance, however, violations are subject to criminal charges.
