PROCLAMATION AMENDING RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY BY MAKING EFFECTIVE ADDITIONAL PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

The following Proclamation is issued by the Mayor of the City of Greenville:

WHEREAS, on June 1, 2020 at 1:00 a.m., as Mayor of the City of Greenville, I issued a Proclamation of Emergency declaring a State of Emergency in the corporate limits of the City of Greenville (hereinafter and sometimes also referred to as the "City" or "designated area") and imposing a certain stated restrictions; and

WHEREAS, City Code § 5-3-17 authorizes the Mayor to amend by proclamation the prohibitions and restrictions imposed as a result of a State of Emergency; and

WHEREAS, information from local law enforcement and other sources indicate that an imminent threat of severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property including large gatherings of individuals, including numerous persons from other locations in the City as well as out of the City's corporate limits, will, in the designated area, continue to destroy property and engage in other unlawful acts including but not limited to riot; inciting others to riot; possess, transport, and/or use dangerous substances, destroy property, and affect public safety; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, based upon said actions, conduct, and continued threats of same, there is a need to modify the prohibitions and restrictions contained in the original Proclamation June 1, 2020 at 1:00 a.m.; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, P.J. Connelly, Mayor of the City of Greenville, do hereby proclaim and declare that my Proclamation of Emergency dated June 1, 2020 at 1:00 a.m., is hereby amended by making effective additional prohibitions and restrictions authorized by N.C.G.S. § 166A-19.22, N.C.G.S. § 166A-19.31, and Title 5, Chapter 3, Article B of the Greenville City Code because said herein additional prohibitions and restrictions are necessary in order to maintain an acceptable level of public order and services and to protect lives, safety, and property during this State of Emergency and that the below restriction shall be in effect as indicated herein:

SECTION A. <u>City Code § 5-3-12 (Curfew)</u>.

- 1. No person shall appear in public in the geographic designated area described in this Proclamation between hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- 2. This curfew shall apply to the following **designated area**:
 - (a) The area within the corporate limits of the City of Greenville.
- 3. The following classes of people are <u>exempt</u> from these curfew restrictions in the circumstances indicated:

- (a) Any police or public safety officer or other government employee engaged in official business.
- (b) Any member, volunteer, or employee of an organization providing disaster relief services.
- (c) Any person in transit from a place where he or she were temporarily engaged and could not have planned his or her departure to avoid the curfew.
- (d) Any medical service provider engaged in delivering medical services, and medical personnel such as doctors, nurses, employees of hospitals and other medical facilities in the performance of their job duties.
- (e) Members of the news media engaged in duties essential to providing public information.

All of the above classes of people exempt from these curfew restrictions must carry proper identification.

Anyone violating any restriction imposed by this Proclamation or under its authority violates a City Ordinance and is guilty of a misdemeanor.

I direct that copies of this Proclamation be disseminated to the mass communications media for publication and broadcast, and that a copy of this Proclamation be posted in City Hall and the Municipal Building.

This Proclamation shall be effective at 8:00 p.m. on June 1, 2020 and shall end at 6:00 a.m. on June 2, 2020.
