WHEREAS, the Cancer Services emphasizes the need for cancer awareness by declaring the month of March as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month;

WHEREAS, according to the American Cancer Society approximately 150,000 new cases of colon and rectal cancers are expected to occur in 2011 in the United States, and over 51,000 will die of the disease;

WHEREAS, in the United States colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer diagnosed in in both men and women (excluding skin cancers);

WHEREAS, colon and rectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States when both men and women are considered;

WHEREAS, the lifetime risk factor for men to develop colorectal cancer is about 1 in 19 men; and the lifetime risk factor for women to develop colorectal cancer is about 1 in 20; and

WHEREAS, early detection of colorectal cancer can lead to cure and increased survival.
