WHEREAS, Mrs. Nora Clark attributes her longevity to eating well, getting plenty of rest and being surrounded by the love of God, family and friends; and


WHEREAS, Mrs. Clark will celebrate her 105th birthday with her family and a host of friends on Saturday, August 20, 2011 in Greenville.
