Title of Item:Public Art Recommendation for DownEast Sculpture Exhibition on City
PropertyExplanation:The DownEast Outdoor Sculpture Exhibition is a national juried art competition
that was started in 2006 as a joint exhibition between Emerge Gallery, the City
of Greenville, and East Carolina Student Galleries. This is a year-long
exhibition of large-scale outdoor sculptures, which has now grown to a total of
16 sculptures throughout Pitt County, including placements throughout the City
of Greenville, East Carolina University, Greenville Museum of Art, the Town of
Winterville, the Town of Ayden, and the Town of Farmville. The sculptures
rotate annually from March to February, with new sculptures being chosen each
year. This is a competition, as a national Request for Proposals is posted on a
call for entries platform, where artists enter their completed sculptures for
consideration to be "leased" and put on exhibit for a year.

This year's juror will be James Matson, and he will be choosing the pool of sculptures that are acceptable for the exhibit and will prioritize the list with prizes for the top three sculptures. This prioritized list first goes to the Civic Arts Committee to make recommendations to the different entities, and then the entities have final approval of the choices.

The deadline for entries from artists was November 20, 2021. The Civic Arts Committee will have their recommendations by December 1, 2021, for the placement of five (5) sculptures throughout the Uptown District and on the greenway. These locations include in front of Chico's at Reade and Cotanche Streets; on the greenway at Harding, Stancil, and Elm Streets; and on the Town Common.

The cost to the City of Greenville for the DownEast Sculpture Exhibition is \$9,000. No City services are required other than the oversight and communication from the partnering City departments. The Civic Arts Committee works with the City Manager's Office, Recreation and Parks Department, and Public Works Department.

Holly Garriott, Executive Director of the Pitt County Arts Council at Emerge, will present the five (5) sculptures recommended for temporary placement on City property.

Fiscal Note: The DownEast Sculpture Exhibition is a component of the FY 2021-2022

contract between the City and the Arts Council. The City's cost of \$9,000 is included in the approved FY 2021-2022 budget.
