Questions and Responses:

1. Question: Is the EWF surfacing to be included in the \$500k budget?

Answer: Yes, Sheet L1.1 notes this "by others", which is the playground vendor.

 Question: Is there a Prime General Contractor that will be performing the site grading and preparation of the playground area as well as forming the mound for Artificial Turf?
 Answer: Yes (Building/Site General Contractor to provide fine grading of artificial turf area with coordination with playground vendor. Playground Vendor to provide artificial turf and any required subgrade material. See Sheet L2.1)

Question: Does drainage need to be included in the playground budget?
 Answer: Yes, a Subsurface drainage system should be provided by the Playground Vendor to connect to the 8" PVC within the play area. See Sheet L2.1

4. Question: Are the planting areas included in the playground budget? Answer: No

Question: Are the CIP concrete sidewalks included in the playground budget/scope?Answer: No

Question: Is the curbing included in the playground budget?
 Answer: Concrete Edging around play oval by Building/Site General Contractor. Plastic Playground edging by Playground Vendor. See Sheet L1.1

7. Question: What is the timeframe for completing the design and installation of the playground? Answer: The City desires to have the design and installation completed in 6 (six) months but recognizes there may be longer lead times for delivery and manufacturing of materials. Please provide estimated lead times in your proposal if proposed equipment and installation will take longer than six months to manufacture and install. The City is open to considering desired options if they require slightly more time.

8. Question: Is there a budget to be considered or identified for the design, fabrication, delivery and installation of the playground equipment?

Answer: The proposed budget is \$500k.
