Re:	Update on Improvements at The Sports Connection

Recreation and Parks staff have been working on various improvements at The Sports Connection the last several months. These improvements included paving of the parking lot, landscape updates and addressing general maintenance needs at the facility. The next phase of the project, which is funded through the Department's Facility Improvement Plan, includes the install of a HVAC unit for the gym, painting throughout and a new gym floor.

Due to supplies being made available earlier than anticipated, the install of the new HVAC unit began this week. This includes the install of the duct work, removal of the current heating elements and the removal of two exterior wall fans. Once the HVAC work is completed, the gym will be painted and then the new floor will be installed. In addition, improvements to the office area will be made during this time.

In order for the crews to expedite the work and finish in 6-8 weeks, staff are recommending the facility stay closed during this time. The closure would not impact any organized activities or programs. The tentative timeline for the project is below:

- July August 12 HVAC install & painting
- August 15 August 26 New flooring install
- August 26 September 2 Project closeout; Facility prepared for public use
- Tuesday, September 6 Sports Connection re-opens after Labor Day Holiday

Staff will be prepared to open the facility sooner if work is completed ahead of schedule. The closure will be communicated via social media and signs on the facility door.

Subject:	Update on the 2022 Street Rehabilitation and Preservation Projects

Construction of the 2022 Street Rehabilitation Project and the 2022 Street Preservation Project began in mid-April 2022. The rehabilitation project included milling, resurfacing, deep patch repairs, concrete work for ADA improvements, curb and gutter repair, and pavement markings for various streets across the City. The preservation project included microsurfacing and crack sealing on a different, but much larger, group of City streets.

As of July 1st, all work has been completed on both projects with the exception of final pavement markings on Howell Street, 14th Avenue, East 4th Street, and Greenfield Boulevard. Due to sound initial quantity estimates by staff and efficient work by the contractor, S.T. Wooten Corporation, staff was able to accomplish rehabilitation of the full length of Greenfield Boulevard as a change order to the 2022 Street Rehabilitation Project; this street was listed as an alternate at the time of bid.

Weather permitting, the contractor should finalize the remaining pavement markings noted above within the next 1-2 weeks.

The three summer campsites, South Greenville Recreation Center, E.B. Aycock Middle School, and Eppes Recreation Center, serve approximately 100 youth. We caught up with them at the bowling alley spending precious time interacting with and forming lasting bonds with Sgt. Richard Williams and Officer Ron White.



Juneteenth Celebrations - June 18, 2022 - The West Greenville Health Council (WGHC) held its 5th Annual

Juneteenth Celebrations in the heart of West Greenville at the Eppes Recreation Center.
