Proclamation

WHEREAS, "Talent Has No Boundaries: Workforce Diversity INCLUDES Workers With Disabilities" is the official theme for October's National Disability Employment Awareness Month. This theme celebrates workforce diversity and workers with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Greenville strongly supports employment of citizens with disabilities and wants to assure that they are fully included in our social, cultural and economic mainstream.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Patricia C. Dunn, Mayor of the City of Greenville, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim October, 2010 as
