WHEREAS, seniors are guaranteed that they will be treated with respect and dignity to enable them to continue to serve as leaders, mentors, volunteers and important and active members of our communities;

WHEREAS, the well-being of seniors is in the interest of all and further adds to the well-being of communities;

WHEREAS, the Ombudsman program, a representative of Mid-East Commission Area Agency on Aging, serving older adults and their caregivers within the counties of Beaufort, Bertie, Hertford, Martin, and Pitt is uniting with the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (INPEA) by asking the public to celebrate the 4^{th} Annual World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. INPEA was founded in 1997 and is dedicated to global dissemination of information as part of its commitment to world-wide prevention of elder abuse; and

WHEREAS, these organizations along with other concerned groups, including the Pitt County Nursing Home/Adult Care Community Advisory Committee, are asking that we show the world that we care about ending elder abuse and neglect by wearing something purple on June 15, 2009;
