# *Proclamation*

**WHEREAS**, the first major effort to promote awareness of the need for adoptive families for children in the foster care system occurred in 1976, when Massachusetts Governor Michael Dukakis issued the first state Adoption Week proclamation. President Gerald Ford made the first National Adoption Week proclamation, and in 1990, the week was expanded to a month due to the number of states participating and the number of events;

**WHEREAS**, in North Carolina, over 3,000 children are awaiting adoption and another 10,000 children are living in foster care. Many of them have spent most of their lives in this temporary situation, and have moved within the child welfare system several times;

**WHEREAS**, in 1992, Dave Thomas, the founder of Wendy's — the famous fast food restaurant chain, established the Dave Thomas Foundation for Adoption. He joined his family through adoption when he was six years old;

**WHEREAS**, the vision for the Foundation is that every child deserves a permanent home and a loving family. The Foundation increases adoption awareness while supporting model adoption services programs; and

**WHEREAS**, The Children's Home Society of North Carolina, The Pitt County Department of Social Services, Carried In My Heart Enterprises, and Wendy's are teaming up to host Dave's Day for Adoption celebrating National Adoption Awareness Month on Wednesday, November 4, 2009, 12:00 p.m. - 2:00 p.m., at Wendy's, 604 SW Greenville Boulevard;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Patricia C. Dunn, Mayor of the City of Greenville, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim November 4, 2009 as
