WHEREAS, the Perkins, Wells, and West Trust Building, which is the Phase I building of the Senior Center complex, will be dedicated on May 8, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Pitt County Council on Aging staff and many volunteers of Pitt County deserve recognition for their steadfast work on behalf and support of this New Senior Center facility;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Patricia C. Dunn, Mayor of the City of Greenville, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 8, 2008 as
