and since then, the Kappa Sigma chapter has successfully initiated 293 women into their illustrious sisterhood; and

WHEREAS, Kappa Sigma chapter was the first black Greek-letter organization for women to be established at East Carolina University (ECU) as well as the surrounding community; and

*WHEREAS*, this chapter is known for providing more programs and service projects on campus than any other black Greek-lettered organization while still maintaining a high chapter GPA. Some programs and projects the chapter has sponsored include:
