WHEREAS, A Day of Prayer is one of our oldest national observances and has been part of our country's heritage since the first one was declared by the Continental Congress in 1775; and

WHEREAS, throughout the history of our country, prayer has been recognized by our leaders in times of war and peace as vital to the maintenance of a strong national character; and

WHEREAS, "America, Unite in Prayer" is the theme for the 2007 National Day of Prayer; and

*WHEREAS*, the National Day of Prayer is an opportunity for all people of all faiths to unite in prayer for our city, state, Nation and all mankind; and

**WHEREAS**, May 3, 2007 marks the 56<sup>th</sup> consecutive observance of the National Day of Prayer as mandated by both Congress and by our President in Public Law 100-307;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Robert D. Parrott, Mayor of the City of Greenville, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 3, 2007 as
