**WHEREAS**, citizens across the country are endeavoring to give greater emphasis to the advancement of persons with disabilities; and

**WHEREAS**, such citizens are valued members of the citizenry; and

**WHEREAS**, employers of the private and public sector and other entities engaged in public accommodations can impact the quality of life experienced by physically and mentally impaired persons; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1990, the United States Congress enacted the Americans with Disabilities Act, which prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in employment, public accommodations, transportation and telecommunications; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Greenville strongly supports employment of citizens with disabilities and wants to assure that they are fully included in our social, cultural and economic mainstream; and


**WHEREAS**, people with disabilities represent a large untapped pool of talent in the City of Greenville;
