WHEREAS, The Greenville Industrial-C. M. Eppes High School Alumni will be celebrating their 28th Anniversary from July 5 - July 8, 2007 in honor of Charles Montgomery (C. M.) Eppes; and

WHEREAS, Charles Montgomery (C. M.) Eppes began his educational career in Greenville in 1903 and served many years as Principal in the Greenville City Schools. As an educator and principal, C. M. Eppes was very instrumental in assuring that quality education was afforded to everyone; and

WHEREAS, in 1932 C. M. Eppes was appointed by Governor O. Max Gardner to serve on North Carolina's Interracial Relations Committee, which held its statewide convention in Greenville that year; and

WHEREAS, because of his dedication to education and to his community, C. M. Eppes High School, C. M. Eppes Middle School, and the C. M. Eppes Recreation Center were named in his honor; and
