Do's & Don't

- **Do** obtain a permit for your vehicle if you reside in one of the permit zones.
- **Do** apply for permit online on the City of Greenville website: parking. GreenvilleNC.gov
- **Do** adhere to the parking rule and regulations on the City of Greenville website: parking.GreenvilleNC.gov
- **Do** dispute/ or pay parking citations in a timely manner to avoid late fees.
- **Don't** attempt to share permits with anyone.
- **Don't** disregard/ignore parking citations.

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. How do I obtain a parking permit? Apply online: parking.GreenvilleNC.gov
- 2. What are the enforcement hours? Parking enforcement hours are 7:00 am–5:00 pm, Monday–Friday.
- 3. Is there any parking available for visitors? In order for a resident to obtain a temporary visitors pass, resident must first obtain a parking permit. Temporary passes are only valid for 30 days, annually.
- 4. How do I pay appeal/pay parking citations? Parking citations can be appealed online: parking.GreenvilleNC. gov. Parking citations can be paid by phone (252) 329-4884, in-person at City Hall, 200 W 5th St., or online: tocite.net/ greenvillenc/Portal.
- 5. What do I do if my vehicle is towed? Call the Greenville Police Department immediately at (252) 329-4315.
- 6. What do I do if I have a permit and I get a new vehicle or license plate number? Contact the staff in the collections department at (252) 329-4884 to update the vehicle information.

Residential Parking

The City of Greenville offers a variety of parking options for residents living on "The Grid" and surrounding our flourishing Downtown District. The Grid is designated zones surrounding ECU's campus.

"The Grid"

There are four zones that make up The Grid: A, B, C, and G Zones. Residents within these zones qualify for one our Residents Parking Permit. This includes the ability to street parking in designated areas within the permitted zones. Residents must be able to provide proof of residency, a valid driver's license, and a valid vehicle registration. The current cost of a Residential Parking Permit is \$12 and are renewed annually on July 1ST. Fee will increase annually by \$2 on July 1ST.

Important Parking Information

- Vehicles cannot be parked on street for more than a 72 hour period. Vehicle will be subjected to being towed.
- Vehicles being parked on the street MUST have a valid tag/ vehicle registration.
- Non-restricted parking is available on:
- » Reade Street within the 100 to 300 blocks
- » Second and Third Streets between Cotanche and Washington Streets
- » First Street (outside of when special event closures are posted)

How to qualify?

Resident looking to apply for the Residential and Uptown Parking must meet the follow requirements:

- Individuals CAN NOT have any outstanding parking citations.
- Individuals must be able to provide proof of residency, current vehicle registration, and driver's license.
