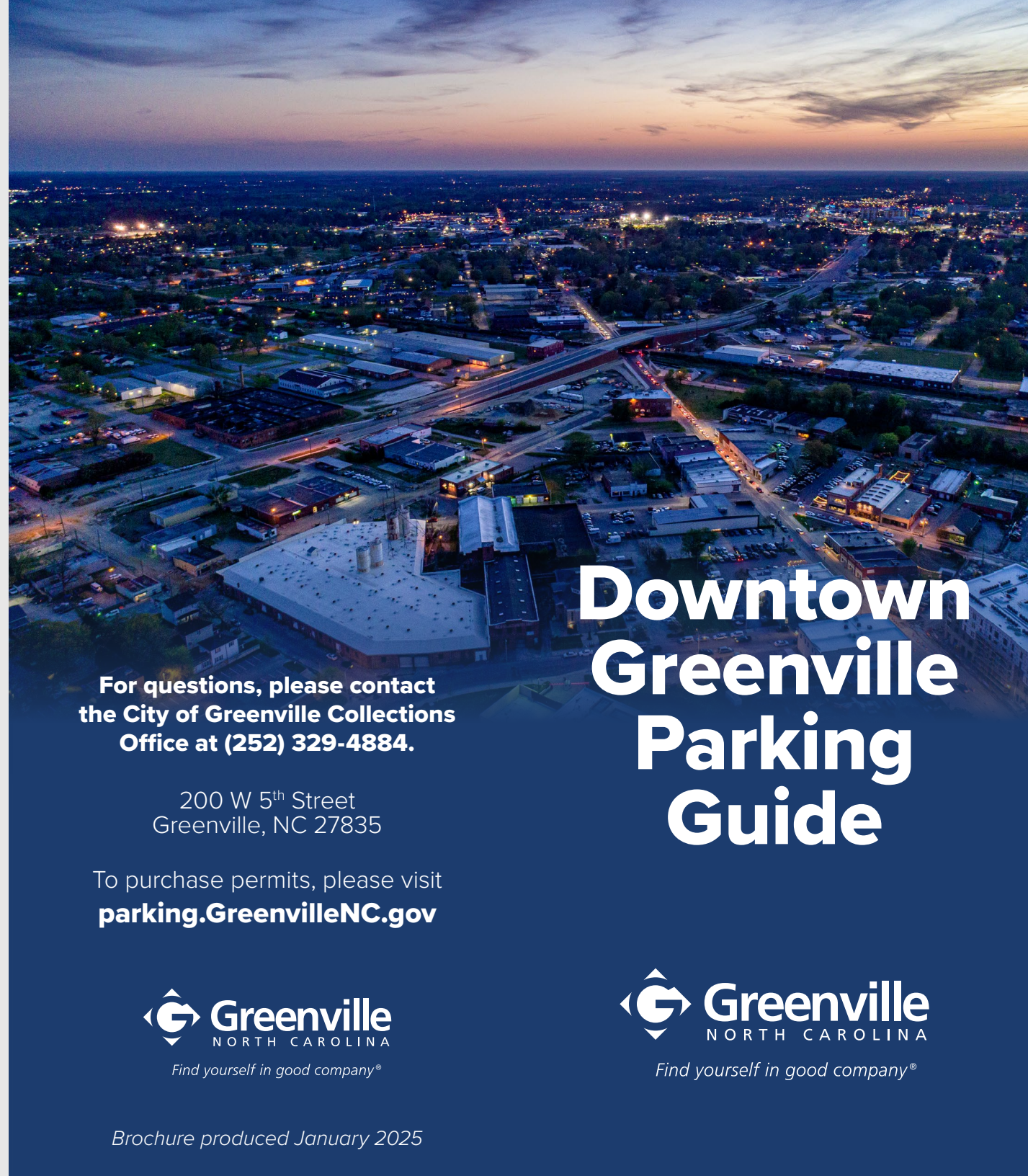


Do's & Don't

- **Do** obtain a permit for your vehicle if you reside or work in the Downtown district.
- **Do** apply for permit online on the City of Greenville website: parking.GreenvilleNC.gov
- **Do** adhere to the parking rule and regulations on the City of Greenville website: parking.GreenvilleNC.gov
- **Do** dispute/ or pay parking citations in a timely manner to avoid late fees.
- **Don't** leave vehicles parked in lots over a 72 hour period. Vehicle will be subjected to being towed.
- **Don't** disregard/ignore parking citations.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. **How do I obtain a parking permit?**
Apply online: parking.GreenvilleNC.gov
2. **What are the enforcement hours?**
Parking enforcement hours are 7:00 am–6:00 pm, Monday–Friday.
3. **What do I do if I have a permit and I get a new vehicle or license plate number?** Contact the staff in the collections department at (252) 329-4884 to update the vehicle information.
4. **How do I pay appeal/pay parking citations?** Parking citations can be appealed online: parking.GreenvilleNC.gov. Parking citations can be paid by phone (252) 329-4884, in-person at City Hall, 200 W 5th St., or online: tocite.net/greenvillenc/Portal.
5. **What do I do if my vehicle is towed?**
Call the Greenville Police Department immediately at (252) 329-4315.

Downtown Parking

The City of Greenville offers a variety of parking options for residents working, living or patronizing business in our flourishing Uptown District.

Public Parking

- For patrons and businesses in the Downtown District
- Enforcement hours are 7:00 am–6:00 pm, Monday–Friday.
- No paid parking (except the Fourth Street Parking Garage)
- Free 2-hour public parking within the following lots: Blount Harvey Lot, Harris Lot, Merchant Lot, Five Points Plaza, Hodges Lot, Chico's Lot, Edwards Lot, Dickinson Ave Lot, and the Clark Street Lot.
- All lots and on-street parking are time restricted with signs posted
- Once allotted time has expired, the vehicle must be moved to different lot to avoid a citation
- Non-restricted parking is available on:
 - » Reade Street within the 100 to 300 block
 - » Second and Third Streets between Cotanche and Washington Streets
 - » First Street (outside of when special event closures are posted)

Reserved Parking

Individual MUST live in the Downtown District between 4th, 5th, and Evans Street (not surpassing Washington Street or Reade Street) to qualify for reserved parking space. Individuals must be able to provide proof of residency (i.e., current lease), a valid driver's license, and a valid vehicle registration.

The current cost of a reserved parking space is \$864 annually in which permit renews bi-annually, January 1ST and July 1ST (\$432 for 6 months). Fee will increase annually by \$2 on July 1ST.

Employee/Employer Parking

The employee/employer permits are designed to give parking options to those working in the Downtown District. To qualify for a permit individual must be able to provide proof of employment, a valid driver license, and a valid vehicle registration. Employers are able to purchase up to 10 parking permits for their employees. Employees may purchase up to 2 of their own parking permits.

The Employee/Employer parking permits gives an individual access to park all day in the following city operated lots: Blount Harvey Lot, Merchant Lot, Five Points Plaza, Edwards Lot, Harris Lot, Hodges Lot, Dickinson Ave Lot, and the Clark Street Lot.

All patrons and Employee/Employer permit holders are excluded from parking in the Greene Street Lot and the Atlantic Ave Bonners Lane Lot.

Employee/Employer permit holders are not permitted to park inside the following lots: Chico's Lot and the Courthouse Lot.

The current cost of an Employee/ Employer permit is \$264 annually in which permit renews bi-annually, January 1ST and July 1ST (\$132 for 6 months). Fee will increase annually by \$2 on July 1ST.
