## Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Saint Paul Pentecostal Holiness Church was established in 1906 in a cottage prayer meeting led by Jacob Benjamin Williams; and

WHEREAS, the first Saint Paul Church, a one-room pine board building, was constructed on what is now East Tenth Street, and later became one of the first schools in the area—the Williams School; and

WHEREAS, today the membership of the church is 282; the church campus contains 10 acres; and the pastors are Allen and Debbie Mayo (Senior Pastors), Jon and Nicole Oliver (Executive Pastors), and Kevin and Shannon Carswell (Associate Pastors of Music); and

WHEREAS, St. Paul Pentecostal Holiness Church is an all-inclusive church, with a mission statement that says, "As a thriving, ever-growing tapestry of all ages, races, and socio-economic backgrounds, St. Paul Church is covering Greenville and the Globe with the Glory of the Lord!"; and

*WHEREAS*, St. Paul Pentecostal Holiness Church will have its centennial celebration on Sunday, September 17, 2006;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Robert D. Parrott, Mayor of the City of Greenville, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim Sunday, September 17, 2006 as
