Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the Junior Counselor program?

The Junior Counselor program allows young adults between the ages of 14-17 years old the opportunity to develop their leadership skills as they assist summer camp staff in daily operations of camp. Junior Counselors are included in all aspects of camp and have the chance to develop new skills such as communication, conflict resolution, problem-solving, and project leadership.

2. Who can apply to be a Junior Counselor?

Anyone between the ages 14-17 (age as of June 16, 2014) wanting to gather work experience before moving into the more demanding role of summer camp counselor.

3. Why should I apply?

The Junior Counselor Program is fun and rewarding! Not only will participants be involved in helping plan, set-up and implement camp activities, they'll also serve as a role model for young campers. The Junior Counselor program will build relationships that last a lifetime; while also strengthening leadership abilities and developing valuable job skills.

4. How does the application process work for becoming a Junior Counselor?

Those interested in becoming a Junior Counselor must complete the Junior Counselor application. Applications are due on or before Friday, April 18, 2014. Chosen applicants will be interviewed and a limited number of candidates will be selected for the program. Once selected, participants will complete a one week orientation and then volunteer opportunities will be available through August 22 with our day camps.

5. What is orientation?

Training will be held the week of June 16-20 at Elm Street Center from 9am-3pm each day. Training will consist of techniques to facilitate activities and group games, proper supervision methods, CPR and First Aid and team building activities.

6. What are the fees for being a Junior Counselor?

The fee for this program is \$90 (cost includes t-shirt, field trips with camps, American Red Cross Child/Adult CPR & First Aid certifications)
