My Street Name: Austin Place

Our neighborhood remained mostly farmland until after World War II. Renewed growth of East Carolina Teacher's College in the 1950s generated a demand for new homes near the college. This demand was met by development of two new subdivisions a mile east of the school: Coghill and College Court. Both subdivisions were intended to attract college faculty and prominent Greenville citizens. For this reason, all of the streets in these two subdivisions were named in honor of individuals who contributed to the early development of 'ECTC'.

Herbert E. Austin (1866 – 1929) was among the first four faculty members selected by President R.E. Wright in 1909. H.E. Austin, a Vermont native, had been a friend of Wright when both studied the 'progressive new' methods of public school teaching then being developed at the Maryland State Normal School. Herbert Austin was named director of the Science Department. By 1919 the college was providing teachers throughout much of eastern North Carolina. These teachers maintained contact with their mentors and college faculty were serving, in the words of Austin, as "consulting engineers" by providing educational advice to area schools and helping to solve community problems.

An 'Administrative Building', completed during 1908, served as administrative offices and classrooms. It remained unnamed until about 1930 when Pres. Wright was authorized to assign names associated with school founders to existing buildings. This was accomplished without official sanction or ceremony. After 1930 the Administration Building became known as 'Austin'. Sometime during the 1950s the legislature authorized the formative years 1907-1982.
